Liffey Partnership are seeking a Community Health Project Officer to join our Health & Inclusion team and play a key role in improving health and wellbeing in Ballyfermot and Cherry Orchard, with a particular focus on supporting the Traveller Community and other groups experiencing disadvantage. This project is delivered in close collaboration with Ballyfermot Traveller Action Project (BTAP). The successful candidate will be a person with a knowledge of and passion for health promotion and the skills and experience to engage with individuals and communities with experience of marginalisation and discrimination.

Key Responsibilities

- Build strong, trusting relationships with community members, particularly those less likely to engage with mainstream health services
- Design, deliver, implement and evaluate health promotion programmes for the wider community and the Traveller community
- Facilitate group work and one-to-one engagement to support improved health and wellbeing
- Engage with a wide range of stakeholders and delivery partners advocating for and securing collaborative approaches to the health needs of marginalised communities.

The Person

The successful candidate will be empathetic, committed, and motivated by social justice. They will understand the impact of inequality, racism, and discrimination on health outcomes and are comfortable working in dynamic community settings. Liffey Partnership encourage applications from members of the Traveller community, people from minority ethnic communities, and others who are under-represented in the sector.

They will ideally have:

- At least 1 years' experience in a relevant community, health, or social inclusion role
- A relevant further or higher education qualification (or substantial equivalent experience)
- Experience working with vulnerable or marginalised communities
